This Spring, the Friends will host our first Zoom presentation of *Books Sandwiched In*. Each presentation will be one hour long and will include a question and answer period. Directions for registration for each session are below.

April 16: Lincoln on the Verge: Thirteen Days to Washington by Edward L. Widmer. Reviewed by James Hare, a former Elmira Mayor and Councilperson, and a retired history teacher.

Kirkus Reviews says: "On February 11, 1861, three weeks before his inauguration, President-Elect Abraham Lincoln boarded a train for Washington, D.C." according to author Widmer. "Lincoln's safe delivery would become, over the next thirteen days, a powerful symbol for the survival of democracy in America. As he traveled his circuitous route, Lincoln carried the aspirations of millions on his shoulders. Around the country they were waiting for him." Jeff Glor of CBS This Morning states, "At last count there were about 15,000 books on Lincoln; not all of them are worth reading, *Lincoln on the Verge* is."

April 23: A Civil War Courtship: The Letters of Edwin Weller from Antietam to Atlanta by William Walton. Reviewed by George Farr, a local history enthusiast, researcher, and lecturer. The author was the grandson of Antoinette Watkins, the woman who was the subject of the letters. She lived in Havana, now known as Montour Falls. Her suitor, Edwin Weller, was a soldier who prior to joining the Union army, lived on Ridge Road and worked in Havana.

Imagine Your Story was a nationwide theme for 2020 Summer Reading Clubs. Funding from Friends of the CCLD provided the themed resources, including bookmarks, water bottles, t-shirts, pencils, and toys. The CCLD gave these items as incentives when participants signed up for the program, and/or as prizes for achieving reading goals along the way (many of the items were mailed to the participants).

Friends funding also was used for CCLD children's projects, including *MadCap Puppets*, *Bright Star Touring Theater: Once Upon a Time* and *Silly Lilly: Puppet Show*.

For adults and teens, the CCLD hosted *Trivia* nights via Zoom, with Friends-funded prizes.

For general programming, Friends funded Hoopla Streaming Service.
